Walk with me, O my Lord

Over the past few months there have been many occasions within the Diocese of Cork and Ross that will remain forever in our hearts and minds. These were not mere events but rather milestones in the lives of each member of the Family of Parishes.

Early in my priesthood, neighbours of my parents who celebrating 75 years of marriage, recounted the Eucharistic Congress in 1932, when they were “stepping out”. They were not permitted to walk together. The men walked along the North Quays and the women on the South Quays with the River Liffey dividing them. The couple married in 1934 and passed away within a few months of each other in 2009.

Last Sunday, Bishop Fintan led the Eucharistic Procession in Cork City where many people joined the procession: walking together, shoulder-to-shoulder, as one family. Thousands thronged the streets and joined in the Benediction on Grand Parade. This was at the culmination of the visit of the Relics of St Carlo Acutis to Cork and Ross and especially to Skibbereen during the bicentenary celebration of the Cathedral of St Patrick.

The visit of the Relics of St Carlo Acutis to Skibbereen was a tremendous success. Many comments have been received on how well the visit was organised and that all pilgrims had the chance to venerate the relics. We thank the parishioners from the Family of Parishes who volunteered their time to make the visit a success and to those who participated in the Liturgy.
